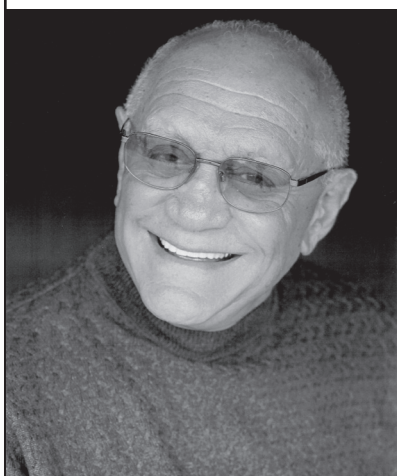

CLINICIAN PROFILES



JERRY TARKANIAN, also known as "Tark the Shark", is one of the winningest coaches in college history. He also is well known for his colorful behavior, including habitually chewing on a towel during games, and for his public criticisms and legendary clashes with the NCAA that eventually paid Tarkanian the largest settlement in NCAA history. Son of Armenian immigrants, Tarkanian was born

in Euclid, Ohio. He graduated from Fresno State in 1955 where he played basketball for the Bulldogs. He later earned a master's degree with honors in educational management from the University of Redlands.

Jerry Tarkanian has 990 all-time career wins at the collegiate level, and a career winning percentage at the Division 1 level of .796%. He has coached 44 players that were drafted into the NBA, including a record 6 in one season. In 1975-76, his UNLV team held the highest scoring average ever, 110.6 points a game, and this was done before the 3-point shot or the shot clock was introduced. He began coaching high school basketball in Fresno, California in 1956 at San Joaquin Memorial High School. He moved to the college ranks in 1961 where he coached at Riverside City College and then Pasadena City College. His teams won four straight championships and that record has never been beaten. He then moved to Division 1 basketball as head coach at Long Beach State where he pioneered the use of Junior College athletes, created the Amoeba zone defense and revolutionized the 1-2-2 zone. Long Beach soon became a regional power.

Jerry continued his success at UNLV, coaching the Runnin' Rebels from 1973-1992. His teams were known for an up-tempo style, stifling defense, and going on long runs that turned close games into blowouts. He took 4 UNLV teams to the final four in 1977, 1987, 1990, and 1991 and finally, in the 1990 NCAA Men's Division 1 Basketball Tournament, Tarkanian led UNLV to the championship, beating Duke 103-73, setting a record for margin of victory in a championship game. After his tenure at UNLV, Jerry returned back to his alma mater, Fresno State in 1995. His six consecutive 20-win seasons—the first time that feat had been accomplished in the history of Bulldog basketball—brought him to 29 20-win seasons in his career.

Jerry Tarkanian retired in 2002 after spending 38 seasons as a collegiate basketball head coach with 778 career Division 1 wins. Jerry lives in Las Vegas with his wife, Councilwoman Lois Tarkanian, his four children and eleven grandchildren.

CLINICIAN PROFILES

NANCY FAHEY, head coach at Washington University in St. Louis, is the 2011 RUSSELL ATHLETIC/WBCA National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III Coach of the Year, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association announced. This is the 29th year of this honor, which has been selected by the WBCA since 1983. Fahey, who has a 595-106 record in 25 years at Washington, is the only coach in NCAA Division III history to win five national championships, including a stretch of four straight crowns from 1998 through 2001. Fahey continued pursuit of her sixth national title when the defending national champion Bears (24-5) made their record 10th appearance in the NCAA Division III Women's Final Four in Bloomington, IL but ended up as runner-ups. Since Fahey's arrival in 1986, Washington has enjoyed its finest 25 seasons. In each of the past 24 years, the Bears have won at least 19 games and have made 23 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. In addition to her 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2010 national championship teams, Washington placed fourth in 1991, and finished second in 1994, 2007 and 2009. Fahey also was selected NCAA Division III National Coach of the Year by the WBCA in 2000.

EDDIE ANDRIST has been a head basketball coach at the professional, college, and high school ranks for (34) years, amassing (530) victories. He owns (3) National Collegiate Championships, (2) Professional International Championships, (6) National Collegiate Final Fours, and (6) Collegiate Conference Championships. Andrism's teams have qualified for (9) NCAA and NAIA National Tournaments. As a teacher of the game, Andrism has conducted and been a speaker at (42) clinics around the world. He has also authored (4) instructional videos on the Run and Jump Full Court Press, Dribble Drive Motion, and a Systematic Approach to Teaching Offensive and Defensive Transition. As the head coach of NAIA Mount Senario College, Andrism owned a (.889) winning percentage, averaging (23) wins per season and left as the all-time winningest coach in school history. At NCAA Wisconsin Stout, Andrism owns records for most wins in a single season, first ever NCAA tournament appearance, and ranks 2nd in all time victories in Stout history. Andrism served as Head National Team Coach for the Middle Eastern country of Qatar, winning the Asian and Gulf Country Championships, Qatar's only major titles in their history. Andrism received his Masters Degree in Physical Education from Winona State University.

MICHAEL PECK finished his fifth year as the Head Coach for the Findlay College Prep basketball team at The Henderson International School in Nevada. In five seasons, Coach Peck is 142-7 and will be competing in their third national championship game. In 2009 he led Findlay to a National High School Championship and an undefeated season at 33-0. In his first year as head coach, he helped guide the team to a 32-1 record along with a National Prep School Runner-Up title. Peck came to Findlay College Prep from the University of Nevada-Las Vegas, where he served for three years under the tutelage of legendary coaches Charlie Spoonhour and Lon Kruger. He served as the Video Coordinator for the men's basketball program during his time at UNLV. He was involved in all aspects of the men's program; video editing and game breakdown, on-campus recruiting, player development, summer camp coordination and numerous administrative tasks. Prior to UNLV, Peck was an assistant coach at Saginaw Valley State University in Saginaw, Michigan from 1998-2003 where he served under his former college coach and current University of Tennessee Women's Basketball Assistant, Dean Lockwood. He also served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Northwood University in Midland, Michigan from 1997-98. During these stints Peck's primary areas of responsibility were on-floor coaching and player development.
